

You will spend six nights on the islands, in specially designed eco-friendly hotels, experiencing a range of activities including snorkelling, mountain biking, and hiking amongst the area's stunning land and marine wildlife.

DAY 1

ARRIVAL AND TRANSFER

Today your thrilling family adventure begins! Upon arrival at Quito Airport, a guide will be waiting to transfer you to your hotel. On the way, they will provide you with an introduction to this remarkable city, which has been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

DAY 2

HIKE AND MOUNTAIN BIKE AT COTOPAXI NATIONAL PARK

This morning, you will journey south from Quito along the Pan-American Highway through the famed "Avenue of Volcanoes." Upon arrival at Cotopaxi National Park, you will head off into the surrounding páramo for a scenic hike. 'Páramo' is elevated, level ground with alpine vegetation, providing outstanding vistas of the surrounding natural beauty. Your short hike will take you around Limpiopungo Glacier Lake providing an opportunity to observe the wealth of highland waterfowl and a chance to learn about the park's highland ecosystem.

Your adventure will continue on mountain bikes as you set off from the base of Volcan Rumiñahi, across the high plain and around to the south side of Cotopaxi, then on to the Pucara Inca ruins. Here, you will explore the ruins and learn more about the western hemisphere's most powerful ancient civilization and their history in Ecuador. You will take



a well-deserved break for a scenic picnic beside the stunning volcano before travelling to the hacienda where we will spend the night.

DAY 3

HORSEBACK RIDING AT HACIENDA & EXPLORE ANDEAN FOREST

Following breakfast, your guide will deliver a safety briefing before you embark upon a charming Hacienda horseback experience towards the western cordillera bound. Here, you will have the chance to observe chacras (small farmlands), adobe houses and livestock such as sheep and llamas. You will learn more about the tradition and customs of the Chagras (Andean cowboys) whose skill on horseback and knowledge of the Ecuadorian outback are legendary. The indigenous way of life, the occasional view of volcanoes Cotopaxi, Tungurahua, Illiniza, Chimborazo and Altar will accompany you throughout this journey in the spectacular trails that cross hills, ravines and dirt roads.

Your journey will continue on a drive up to the Leito Valley where you can appreciate breath-taking views of the Tungurahua Volcano and the Patate River. In the afternoon, you will bike ride along Patate River gorge which boasts beautiful landscapes and quaint towns before reaching the cosy Andean Hacienda. This evening, you will have time to relax and enjoy a delicious dinner.

DAY 4

BIKING TO THE AMAZON AND A VISIT TO THE FAMOUS WATERFALL ROUTE

This morning, your guide will drive you to the edge of Llanganates National Park, gaining altitude until you reach an area with one of the best views of the – often fuming – Tungurahua Volcano. Here, you will set off on mountain bikes for a picturesque ride through highland paramo. Notice how the landscape gradually melts into mountain cloud forest, and then lowland rainforest. You will pass through a dry basaltic gorge; a superb spot to look for wild orchids. You will continue riding along the Pastaza River Gorge, one of the principal waterways that feed into the Amazon Basin. There will be plenty of opportunities to admire the dramatic scenery from deep cloud forest canyons to remarkable waterfalls such as Pailón Del Diablo (Devil's Cauldron) and Manto de la Novia (Bride's Veil.)

Afterwards, you will travel along the Amazon highway to the Huasquilla Amazon Eco Lodge and if time allows, you will visit a Kichwa indigenous community. Here, you will discover their way of life, culture, traditions, and customs of the Amazon. At the end of the day, you will have the chance to settle into your jungle lodge ready for a peaceful evening surrounded by rainforest sounds.

DAY 5

JUNGLE RAFTING ON THE JATUNYACU RIVER

After a delicious breakfast in the lodge, you will drive to Llanganates National Park, which extends from the high Andes down into the Amazon basin and is part of an area declared a Biosphere Zone by the United Nations. The water that collects in this area forms the Jatunyacu River, which is considered Ecuador's best one-day river run. These crystal-clear waters provide big waves and lots of fun but there are also quieter stretches where you can catch glimpses of the local communities and wildlife that live on the shore. The day will begin with a walk in the jungle to reach naturally formed swimming pools.

Upon your return and after a safety briefing, your whitewater rafting adventure begins. A trip down the Jatunyacu River offers spectacular jungle scenery, crystal-clear water, and glimpses into indigenous communities that live along the shores in small bamboo and wood houses. The group will navigate the Jatunyacu, whose waters carry you through breathtaking landscapes with abundant bird life.

In the evening, there will be times to relax and explore the rainforest surrounding the Huasquila Jungle Lodge if you wish.

DAY 6

PAPALLACTA HOTSPRINGS AND TRANSFER TO QUITO

After breakfast, you will be driven back up into the Andes, climbing from 1,500 to 10,000 feet (500 to 3,000 meters) in altitude and passing through a national park and nature reserve until you reach the Papallacta Hot springs Resort and Spa. Indulge in the dreamy therapeutic waters and world class spa overlooking a small village, high in the lush cloud forest and surrounded by verdant mountain slopes, hummingbirds, and tropical flowers.

After lunch, you will complete the journey to Quito, with the afternoon and evening free to make the most of the city.

DAY 7

INTERPRETATION CENTER, HIKE AND SNORKEL TIJERETAS

Today your Galápagos Islands adventure begins as you take a short flight after breakfast, transferring from Quito to the beautiful island of San Cristóbal. Following lunch and a quick introduction, you will commence your journey at the fascinating 'Galápagos Interpretation Centre' to learn about the unique wildlife, geology, history, and social dynamics of the archipelago.

After your visit, you will hike to Tijeretas along natural trails formed of lava rocks which offer scenic views over the rugged coastline and potential encounters with the famous





frigate birds which live here along with gulls, herons and pelicans. The path is surrounded by native plants like Galápagos cotton, palo santo, acacia, and cacti.

Cool off from your hike with a refreshing snorkeling session at postcard-worthy Carola Beach, which is home to a remarkable array of sea creatures including basking sea lions, turtles, colourful crabs and shoals of tropical fish.

This evening, we would recommend heading to the boardwalk close by to greet the neighboring colony of Galápagos sea lions that have made a home there.

DAY 8

KAYAK AND SNORKEL IN SAN CRISTOBAL'S NORTHERN COAST

Wake up to another day in paradise and prepare for another day of ticking off bucket-list dreams. The morning will be filled with a kayaking expedition exploring some of the most beautiful routes along the coastal bays and coves of San Cristobal's north coast. Keep a lookout for blue footed boobies, frigate birds, sea lions, and sea turtles. You will visit the impressive rock formations at Leon Dormido, also known as Kicker Rock, where you might see spotted eagle rays, golden rays, hammerheads, and white-tipped sharks.

After lunch, you will spend the afternoon snorkelling in a bay popular with turtles and marine iguanas – just magical! You will swim with spotted eagle rays, golden rays, Galápagos sharks, starfish, clams, and fish of every shape, size, and color. With luck, you might even see some menacing but harmless hammerhead sharks! After a full day spent exploring the seas, you will head back to town for a delicious dinner and a well-earned rest.

DAY 9

BIKE THE COASTLINE AND EXPLORE TINTORERAS ISLETS

After breakfast, it's time to say goodbye to San Cristobal and take a light aircraft across to Isabela Island, the largest island of the Galápagos Archipelago. Isabela is one of the most volcanically active spots on the planet and is still being formed by six active shield volcanoes. Upon arrival, you will embark on a mountain bike ride with a specialist guide who will lead you through the inland trails to the Wall of Tears: a link back to the days when the island was a penal colony. Prisoners built this wall to give themselves a purpose and distract themselves from the madness of isolation – an impressive construction with a tragic history. The cycling route is varied and passes white sand beaches, lava features, and mangroves. You may even bump into a giant tortoise or flamingo as they cross your path!

After lunch, you will explore the beautiful Tintoreras Islets, home to the recognisable Galápagos Penguin. After that, it will be time to unwind at the Iguana Crossing Hotel and its outdoor Jacuzzi with panoramic views of the sea and volcano. Dinner will be served in



the on-site restaurant where you can expect a gourmet menu of regional specialities. The hotel prides itself on their impressive grill carved out of lava stone. Here, the chef creates delicacies accompanied by organic vegetables grown and harvested in their own hacienda in the highlands.

DAY 10

HIKING IN ISABELA'S HIGHLANDS

Following breakfast, you will be driven up the flanks to one of the most enchanting spots on the islands. The active Sierra Negra Volcano has dramatic landscapes of spectacular lava formations and puffing fumaroles. It is the second largest active caldera on the planet, over six miles at its widest point. Reaching the rim of the gigantic caldera is incredibly rewarding. If you're feeling energetic, it will be possible to hike further to the Chico Volcano caldera, an otherworldly landscape of vibrant hues created by sulfur deposits.

Returning from the volcano, you will stop at an idyllic tortoise reserve for lunch. This afternoon you are free to relax - we highly recommend relaxing on the perfect beaches and soaking up the island-life atmosphere. Dinner will be served at the hotel.

DAY 11

HIKE THE SANTA CRUZ HIGHLANDS

Wake up with the sea breeze as you travel by speedboat or internal flight to Santa Cruz Island. Whales and dolphins are commonly seen on this crossing so be sure to keep an eye out for these impressive sea mammals.

Docking at the Angermeyer Waterfront Inn, you will drop off your bags before being taken to the island's highlands to walk alongside its famous giant tortoises in its natural habitat. It is truly an honour to walk in the stately presence of these gentle giants, who can live to be over 175 years old. You will then explore some of the island's wonderful lava tunnels which were historically used by pirates to allegedly hide their plundered Incan gold stolen from Spanish ships. A hike will also be made to two immense sinkholes known as 'Los Gemelos', or 'The Twins'. Your path will lead you through a forest of endemic Scalesia trees, where you will be on the lookout for the elusive short-eared owl. The trees are covered with ferns and epiphytes, and lend the forest a quiet, eerie feel.

Towards the end of the afternoon, you will head back to the Angermeyer Waterfront Inn. Enjoy dinner here and look out over the beautiful bay.

DAY 12

KAYAK IN LAVA WALL CHANNELS AND HIKE TO TORTUGA BAY

This morning you will use sea kayaks again to explore a very different coastline as you explore the unique landscape of Punta Estrada and Divine Bay. Following breakfast, you will paddle across turquoise waters and through dramatic lava caves. Below the surface, you might see rays and white-tipped reef sharks swimming around whilst. Keep a look out for the crabs, iguanas and birds which perch along the cliffs.

Lunch leads into a hike through a distinctively dry forest to the picturesque Tortuga Bay - one of the most beautiful locations in the Galápagos Islands. Here you and your family can enjoy the idyllic white sandy beaches, pristine waters and picture-perfect views of the ocean. What a way to end your time on the islands!

If time allows, you will stop for a visit at the Charles Darwin Research Station to learn from local scientists about the ongoing conservation efforts on these enchanted islands. The Research Station rears endemic plants, land iguanas, and giant tortoises for educational, scientific, and conservation purposes. Here, you can discover more about the diverse evolutionary paths and characteristics of the animals and plants that you have encountered during your trip.

A final Galápagos dinner will be had at the Angermeyer Waterfront Inn.

DAY 13

TRANSFER TO BALTRA'S AIRPORT

Today, you will transfer to Baltra Island for our return flight to the mainland and bid a fond farewell to the Galapagos. You will have a free afternoon in the capital and overnight at Hotel Quito.

Ibis Quito (Nights: 1,6,13-14)



Located just 750 yards from the beautiful green space of Carolina Park, this 3-star hotel also puts you within walking distance of many different restaurants so you can sample the delicious local food. There are plenty of facilities to enjoy inside the hotel too, including the dining area, fitness centre and bar.

This Ibis Quito, with its excellent location and friendly staff, will give you and your family a brilliant welcome to Ecuador.

Room type

DOUBLE OR TWIN ROOMS

These spacious, air-conditioned rooms come with either a double or two single beds and a private bathroom. In some rooms, there is also a sofa bed.

Hacienda El Porvenir (Tierra del Volcan) (Nights: 2)









This friendly Hacienda accommodation is set in 1000 hectares of private land and provides a fantastic welcome that is sure to make you feel like one of the family.

Built from locally-sourced materials, the hacienda has been designed to be in keeping with traditional architecture and colour palette throughout. The thatched roof and the unique furniture create a cosy atmosphere and the log fires (in addition to the heating) add to the feel.

Families can enjoy stunning views over the Rumiñahui volcano from the accommodation's privileged position (at an altitude of over 3600 metres).

Hotel facilities

- The restaurant here specialises in traditional Andean recipes with a touch of international cuisine. It uses locally-sourced produce where possible in the menus and meals are served in a relaxed, family-style atmosphere
- The products used are fresh and locally-grown and all the bread, jams and dairy goods served at breakfast are produced on the farm
- There are also numerous lounge areas with fireplaces to enjoy in the evening and a bar will also be open to purchase drinks
- Internet access is available at the hacienda
- A neighbouring playground and a garden for children to enjoy

Room type

Hacienda rooms: There are only 22 rooms here and they offer various styles of accommodation. Our families will stay in the traditional hacienda rooms which are fully heated and beautifully furnished in a rustic and comfortable style.

The rooms are en-suite and have two queen-size beds.

Hacienda Leito (Nights: 3)











Close to the Llanganates National Park and at the base of Tungurahua Volcano, Hacienda Leito is a calm and cosy spa resort surrounded by mountainous beauty. Outside, there are close to five acres of gardens with some 200 different types of local plants. Take in the scenery while relaxing after a day of activities.

Hotel Facilities

- Spend time splashing around as a family in the swimming pool
- Parents will love visiting the Turkish Baths or treating themselves to a gentle massage
- Enjoy delicious local and international cuisine at the hacienda's 'El Rey de la Leña' restaurant
- The bar has an excellent selection of drinks from different parts of the world

Room Type

Double or triple room: These have a double bed or three single beds, an en-suite bathroom with a bathtub, a fireplace and a private balcony with views of the gardens or mountains.

Huasquila Amazon Eco Lodge (Nights: 4-5)







This unique family-friendly hotel is right in the heart of the Amazon rainforest for a truly





authentic stay. With panoramic jungle views from your charming cabin, this is an unbelievable way to enjoy the nature around you.

Hotel facilities

- Sample the food from the restaurant and sit out on the deck with incredible jungle views.
- Relax in the pool and Jacuzzi.
- Explore the surrounding gardens filled with lush tropical plants.

Room type

Your two night's stay will either be in a bungalow or cabin depending on the size of your family. Combining traditional architecture with modern amenities, these are eco-lodges with all the comforts you need.

FAMILY BUNGALOWS FOR 3-5 PEOPLE

These spacious cabins come with a large bathroom, hot showers and balconies with hammocks to relax in.

DOUBLE BUNGALOWS FOR UP TO 2 PEOPLE

These smaller cabins come with a modern and private bathroom and, a balcony with a hammock to soak up the wonderful surroundings.

LODGE VILLAS

These large villas come with three double rooms with the option to add an extra bed to make them triple occupancy. Each spacious room comes with its own private bathroom and balcony. The villa is ideal for families as it includes a private kitchen and internal living room. The highlight, however, is the large deck that offers brilliant views of the Antisana Reserve. Make sure you look out for the variety of bird species flying around.

Casa Opuntia (Nights: 7-8)











Named after the local prickly pear cactus, Casa Opuntia is a small cosy hotel located right at the end of the boardwalk on San Cristobal Island. Its location, only a few metres from Playa de Oro beach, offers one of the best locations on the island in our opinion.

The hotel has strong environmental practices, with a focus on recycling and using sustainable resources to help to maintain its unique and beautiful local environment.

Hotel facilities

- The open-air terrace area at the front of the hotel is where you will enjoy your meals, looking out across the waterfront. These are a mix of traditional and locally-sourced seafood dishes (such as the hotel's famed ceviche) and some international flavours. Fresh produce and delicious tropical fruits feature throughout
- The hotel has an outdoor swimming pool with terrace and enjoys close proximity to the beach (very popular with the local sea lion colony in the late afternoon and evening) ensuring a relaxing hideaway with lots of opportunities to photograph the local wildlife
- We also highly recommend taking a walk along the boardwalk to pick up some souvenirs, and enjoy a refreshing cold drink
- Free Wi-Fi is available in public areas
- The hotel has an honour system for the bar (including alcoholic drinks) so we would recommend bringing some cash if you would like to indulge in a cold drink around the hotel swimming pool

Room type

Hotel rooms: The hotel only has 13 bright and modern rooms in total. All rooms are ensuite and offer air-conditioning and an in-room safe for valuables. They are very bright and the decor is in keeping with their beachside location.

The rooms at the hotel vary in size and can accommodate between two and four people in double, triple and family rooms (subject to availability).

Iguana Crossing (Nights: 9-10)











This boutique-style hotel boasts a beautiful location opposite one of the most beautiful beaches in the Galapagos Islands, which, as you would expect from the name, is home to native marine iguanas. These animals can regularly be seen crossing the road to take a quick dip in the lagoon behind the hotel before wandering back into the sea when the tide changes.

The hotel has a strong environmental focus and has a strict policy throughout. During construction of the hotel, local materials were used wherever possible and all were sustainably sourced.

Hotel facilities

- There is an infinity pool on the terrace area and a rooftop Jacuzzi and bar area at your disposal. These are wonderful places to relax in after a day's exploration
- The restaurant serves a delicious range of cuisines including some excellent regional dishes such as sancocho (an authentic Ecuadorian soup) and dishes regularly feature locally-grown, organic vegetables and freshly caught seafood. The restaurant also boasts a carved lava stone grill
- Downstairs there is a games room for the children and the beautiful lounge area is a wonderful place to watch the sunset over the beach

Room type

Double/twin rooms: The hotel offers both volcano and ocean-view rooms – either is a very special option – with twin beds or a king size bed.

The rooms have been designed with large windows to help maximise your enjoyment of your surroundings. All rooms are spacious and modern and have air-conditioning, hairdryer, safe, TV and telephone.

Angermeyer Waterfront Inn (Nights: 11-12)











This hotel is based in the south of Santa Cruz Island, sat looking out over the water at the town of Puerto Ayora. Just a short walk from Alemanes Beach, it has its own docking area for taxi boats and can only be accessed by water. Built around the famous Angermeyer 'Cave', a home constructed by early Santa Cruz settler Gus Angermeyer, the hotel keeps its heritage very much alive, welcoming families from all around the world.

Hotel Facilities

- Gaze over the sea as you dine in the waterfront restaurant
- Unwind in the comfy bar and lounge area, which is part of the original 'Angermeyer Cave'
- · Look out from the deck at marine iguanas and sea lions swimming by

Room Type

Triple room: three single beds or one double and one single bed, a private bathroom with a bathtub, air-conditioning, a cable television, ceiling fan and minibar.

Terms - payment and cancellation terms (Ecuador & Galapagos)

Payment and cancellation terms:

Please note that the following payment and cancellation terms supersede those mentioned in sections 2 and 7 of our general booking terms and conditions.

Payment terms:

- A deposit of 20% of the total holiday cost is required at the time of booking. Full payment





is required 60 days prior to departure.

- If your booking is less than 59 days before departure, full payment of the holiday cost is required.

Cancellation terms:

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Whilst travel insurance is always a prerequisite to travelling with the Artisan Travel Company. On the 1st May 2018, a new law came into power which states that **all tourists** entering Ecuador **are required to have travel insurance** that covers them in Ecuador for the duration of their stay. This policy must include cover for any necessary medical treatment (including emergencies) during your stay. This is now an entry requirement from the Ecuadorian Government and evidence must be provided at Immigration at all of the major airports and ports to be granted entry to the country. Failure to do so is likely to result in entry to the country being denied. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are in possession of all necessary travel and health documents before departure. All costs incurred in obtaining such documentation must be paid by you. We regret we cannot accept any liability if you are refused entry onto any transport or into any country due to failure on your part to carry correct documentation.
