Trip Overview

Harriniva is situated around 3km from the small Arctic town of Muonio, on the banks of the river which divides Sweden and Finland. It is an excellent location from which to explore the surrounding wilderness and offers easy access to some exceptional trails for the likes of snowmobiling and dog sledding.

The team at Harriniva are family activity specialists and they have their own sled dog centre on-site. This means that their range of activities is excellent and there is sure to be something to suit every member of the family. There are snowmobile adventures, reindeer encounters, snowshoe walks and a wealth of other options to choose from.

This is a place which offers a real sense of adventure as guests come and go on their activities and all congregate in the evenings to discuss their experiences over dinner.

You have total control over your holiday during this family pick and mix as you can choose the activities you wish to participate in. Subject to flight and accommodation availability you can usually travel at any time throughout the winter season from January onwards (do book early for any time around half term).

Aurora Snow Train

Step inside the cosy Snow Train carriage for an Aurora hunt into the wilderness.

Pulled along by your expert guide on a snowmobile, the Snow Train has been cunningly designed with an all-Perspex exterior to give you constant views of the night sky. As you journey further into the darkness, keep your eye out for a potential display.

You'll also stop in a prime location to enjoy hot drinks and continue your search. Your location will be chosen based on the local weather and Aurora forecast for the evening, giving you the best possible chance of ticking the Northern Lights off your family's bucket list.

Tour de Olosvuoma (15km husky safari)(Harriniva only)

After a visit to the Arctic Sled Dog Centre and instruction on how to control a team and sled, you will embark on a 15km husky safari. You will travel two people per sled with opportunities to switch between driver and passenger. Guides, instruction and equipment are included.

Ice fishing

This is a real family favourite and gives you a taste of a very traditional pastime. Ice fishing involves drilling a hole in a frozen lake and dropping your line into the waters beneath. The rods are ideal for children and adults alike. A guide will set you up and will be on hand with a warm drink before you settle in and await a bite on the line.

Northern Lights explorer by minibus

Head out in a heated minibus in search of the Aurora. Your guide will consult local weather forecasts and solar activity levels in order to determine the best possible location from which to view the Lights. Whilst we can't guarantee success, the mobility of the minibus allows you the chance to travel further into the surrounding wilderness and improve your chances.

Snowmobile to Torassieppi Reindeer Farm and Winter Village

You will be shown how to operate a snowmobile and given a full safety briefing before following your guide on a 40km safari through the winter landscape en route to Torassieppi Reindeer Farm and Winter Village.

On arrival at the farm, you will have the chance to meet and feed the reindeer, and of course take plenty of photos. Following on from your animal encounters you will head to the nearby Winter Village for lunch in the ice restaurant.

While this trip is based on people travelling two per vehicle and swapping the roles of driver and passenger, you can also upgrade for an additional cost to drive one person per vehicle. Anyone wishing to drive a snowmobile must be in possession of a full driving licence and be 18 years or older (supplement applies).

Children will typically travel in a sleigh pulled by the guide's snowmobile.

Who's the meister? (9km husky safari)(Harriniva only)

Having met the many huskies of the Arctic Sled Dog Centre, you will be shown how to control a dog sled before trying out what you have learnt on a 9km route. This is a fantastic way to get introduced to husky safaris, and children will love meeting the





dogs.

You will travel two people per sled, with the opportunity to swap the roles of driver and passenger.

Ski like a Finn!

Cross-country skiing is one of the most popular pastimes in Lapland and you will see families with very young children out on the trails together. Full instruction will be provided before you hit the trails and try out your skills.

Local culture and short reindeer safari (3km)

Learn about the culture of the original Lappish reindeer herders at one of the oldest farms in Finland. On this activity, you will head to a local reindeer farm and find out about the herder's way of life, take a tour of the on-site museum to discover more of the history, and enjoy an enchanting reindeer sleigh ride. Lunch is served in a traditional Lappish 'kota' around an open fire.

From late December, you will then enjoy a tour of the nearby Torassieppi Winter Village which features snow rooms, ice sculptures and a very cool restaurant!.

A warm drink will be served as you wait patiently for a potential sighting of the Northern Lights.

Snowshoes and Arctic Elements Lakeside Spa

Snowshoes provide access to areas which would otherwise be out of bounds for those on foot during the winter months. You will be transferred to the Pallas Fell area, which offers breathtaking wilderness scenery and strap on your snowshoes. You will visit the Pallas Nature Centre and a picnic lunch will be served in Jeris.

To finish, you will be taken to the lovely Arctic Elements Lakeside Spa at Hotel Jeris. Saunas are a traditional Finnish pastime and at Jeris, you can enjoy the wonderful lakeside surroundings as well as the different sauna experiences. The spa is the first of its kind in Finland, with strong eco-credentials thanks to the geothermal heating generated from the Jerisjärvi lake, 100% renewable electricity from wind, water or solar power and the shower water from the nearby under earth fountain.

The four saunas each represent the four elements; earth, air, fire and water, as these are found in all traditions and shamanic wellbeing rituals. These elements combine to create a fifth, steamy löyly, the spirit of sauna. Each element is represented by Finnish gods or





goddesses, as the protectors of the saunas:

Sauna of Tapio (Earth). Tapio is the antlered king of the forest and in this sauna, you will feel the earthly and forest surroundings of the Finnish wilderness. Created from wood, tiles and natural stone, the sauna is split into four areas, north, east, south and west, each providing a different kind of löyly from mild to hot.

Sauna of Ukko (Fire). Ukko is the king of all gods and master of lightning, fire and air. This smoke sauna is the most traditional, and a favourite among the Finns. The wood heating process carries the smoke throughout to create a dark colouring, smokey scent and if you choose, a fiery heat.

Sauna of Vellamo (Water). Vellamo is the goddess of water and the ruler of lakes and rivers. This sauna has a panoramic view over Lake Jeris, a holy place for Sámi people, with its waters reflecting light onto the sauna walls it offers an incredibly calming atmosphere. The soft and moist löyly means you can stay in for longer for extended relaxation.

Sauna of Ilmatar (Air). Ilmatar is the goddess of wind and the first mother in the beginning of times. Made from wood and natural stone, this sauna has no fire or thick walls - instead infrared heaters are situated inside a traditional kota for a soft and gentle heat. Think of this as half sauna, half relaxation room.

For the adventurous (and healthy), you can even try a dip in the ice pool!

Arctic Elements Lakeside Spa

This may well be a favourite with the grownups as this trip is all about relaxation. You will head to Harriniva's sister hotel at Jeris for some time in the lakeside well-being facilities.

Saunas are a traditional Finnish pastime and at Jeris, you can enjoy the wonderful lakeside surroundings as well as the different sauna





experiences. The Arctic Elements Lakeside Spa is the first of its kind in Finland, with strong eco-credentials including geothermal heating generated from the Jerisjärvi lake, 100% renewable electricity from wind, water or solar power and the shower water from the nearby under earth fountain.

The four saunas each represent the four elements; earth, air, fire and water, as these are found in all traditions and shamanic wellbeing rituals. These elements combine to create a fifth, steamy löyly, the spirit of sauna. Each element is represented by Finnish gods or goddesses, as the protectors of the saunas:

Think of this as half sauna, half relaxation room.

You can also choose to upgrade to the private Northern Lights sauna. Tulikettu is the mystical firefox that lights up the sky and creates the Auroras. This two-storey panorama sauna is ideally situated under the open sky with a 180-degree view over Lake Jeris. The relaxing room on the second floor has an all-sky panoramic window for a clear view of the night sky and if conditions are favourable, the Northern Lights. This sauna is perfect for private relaxation and comes with its own toilets, changing room and showers. Please ask our Family Travel Experts if you wish to include the Northern Lights sauna in your package.

There's also the chance to have a go at ice swimming if you are feeling brave! Transfers and towel are included.

Reindeer Aurora experience

A warm drink will be served around a campfire. You will travel two people per sled.

Panorama safari (30km snowmobile safari)

During this thrilling snowmobile safari, you will explore the fells and forests around Harriniva. It provides a great introduction to the area and to snowmobiling.

You will cover around 30km and travel with two people per machine along trails which lead you through stunning scenery; children will travel in a sled pulled by the guide's snowmobile. There will

be the chance to change drivers if you both have a driving licence and are over 18.

Aurora adventure (20km snowmobile safari)

The chances of seeing the Aurora Borealis are enhanced on this night safari by snowmobile. After a safety briefing and instruction, you will set off on your machine travelling two people per snowmobile (children will travel in a sleigh pulled by the guide's snowmobile).

Covering approximately 20km you will reach the top of a nearby fell where you will enjoy a warm

drink and gaze out at the night sky. You can change drivers as long as both have driving licences and are over 18.

Fat biking - rental

Fat biking is a real phenomenon in Lapland as it is a great way to explore further than you may get with cross-country skis or snowshoes whilst still being able to appreciate the peace and quiet of this winter wonderland. You will be able to rent a bike with special wide tyres which will allow you much better grip than a traditional bike would get in the snow and a helmet too. This is not a guided activity so we highly recommend talking to the team at reception and planning out a suitable route before you set off from the hotel.

Aurora Glamping Overnight

You can't get a much cosier Northern Lights hunt than spending a night in an Aurora Dome! This luxury tent overlooks the beautiful wilderness with spectacular views provided by the see-through side wall.

Lay in bed and look out into the natural surroundings and up to the dark skies – if conditions are favourable you could very well see the Auroras as you and the family are tucked up in your duvets!

Toilet, sauna and shower facilities are easily accessible just 100m away.

Complete your winter adventure with a night in a snow igloo. These impressive structures combine an age-old design that keeps the outside elements out with modern comforts such as the Arctic grade sleeping bags to ensure you stay warm all night.

Stay cosy on your soft mattress and take a deep breath of the incredibly fresh air that fills the igloos.

Minimum age: 12 years old

Overnight in the wilderness lodge

You will be transferred by minibus to the wilderness cabin (around 45 minutes' drive). Far from any light pollution and deep in the forest, this is a perfect location to hopefully catch sight of the Northern Lights. Enjoy a traditional wood-heated sauna, followed by dinner around the fire.

The cabin has shared facilities and you will sleep in dormitory-style accommodation. You will return at

around 11 am the following morning.

Harriniva Wilderness Hotel (Nights: 1-7)









Harriniva offers families a friendly and comfortable base for an Arctic adventure. The hotel is owned and run by the Pietikäinen family who owns four hotels in the area. All their hotels offer the same warm atmosphere and Finnish charm that keeps families entertained every season and ensures they are some of our most sought-after destinations.

Hotel facilities

- The focal point of the main building is the restaurant, which consists of three dining areas. The food served here is simple but hearty, with a varied buffet for breakfast and the evening meal generally consisting of a buffet of salad starters and dessert and a set main meal (please let us know any dietary requirements in advance). Food generally consists of both local and international dishes, suiting all tastes
- Next door to the restaurant there is a small bar area which generally stays open until around 11 pm
- Tea and coffee are available free of charge throughout the day in the hotel restaurant / bar area.
- There are separate sauna facilities for male and female guests and these are free of charge in the evening and generally heated for around three hours
- Free Wi-Fi is available throughout the hotel and a PC is available at reception for guests to use
- There is a small souvenir shop in the reception area which sells a small selection of gifts and snacks
- You will find the Aurora Wellness Centre on the banks of the river which offers a
 wide range of therapies and treatments. Availability can be limited, so we would
 advise booking these in advance

Room types

- **Standard rooms:** there are 64 rooms at the hotel, all of which are en-suite with shower rooms. These are comfortably furnished in wooden Scandinavian décor. The rooms are cosy and have a hairdryer for guests' convenience. There are no televisions in the rooms but there are TV rooms available should you want to sample some Finnish TV.
- **Please note:** the hotel can usually accommodate your bed set up preference but this can't be guaranteed. Upgrades available on request





The hotel has a small number of room upgrade options available. Please contact us for a quotation and to check availability.

Wilderness plus rooms: these rooms include double/twin beds and an unfolding sofa suitable for 1 adult or 2 children. Decorated in traditional Scandinavian style, all rooms have an en-suite shower room and a hairdryer, as well as a small seating area.
